Goal:

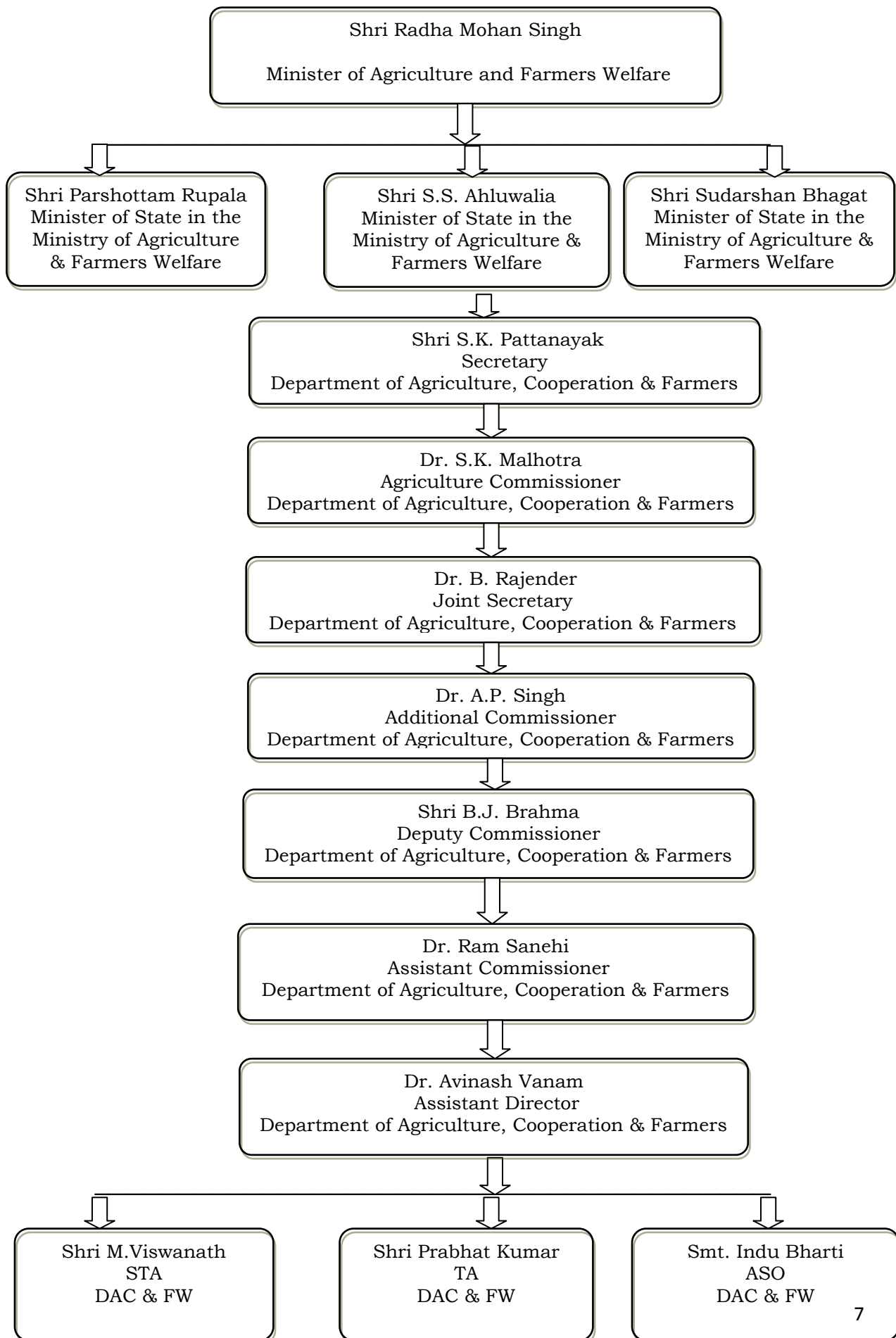
Sustainable growth of Indian Agriculture by up keeping and monitoring the crop situation with efficient and effective support.

Priority Issues

6. PRIORITY ISSUES:

(i) Weekly crop weather watch Report:-

Preparation of Crop Coverage data in the Inter-Ministerial Weather Watch Group meeting held on every Friday. Based on the discussion in the meeting, issues of crop advisories are taken up with the Crop Development Directorates/States.

(ii) Video Conference:-

Weekly monitoring of sowing progress, rainfall, weather related information, pest disease or any other information relevant to agriculture are discussed with the State Department of Agriculture & video conference & report is prepared accordingly.

(iii) EXIM Committee:-

Examination & preparation of comments on proposals to be laid before Export/Import committee w.r.t. seeds, planting material & participation in the EXIM committee meeting.

(iv) Parliament Questions :-

During parliament session, materials are collected from different Divisions/Departments/States & reply is prepared for timely submission of the reply.

(v) Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY):-

Detailed Project Report of the States related to crops Division are scrutinized; comments are prepared for timely submission to RKVY Division and attends the Pre-SLSC meetings.

(vi) DAC-ICAR Interface meeting:-

Issues to be raised before ICAR for recommendations, after discussion in group meeting, the recommendations are sent to Extension Division. DAC& FW-ICAR interface meeting is generally conducted during the month of March & September for Kharif & Rabi season respectively.

(vii) Irrigation Projects:-

Examination of the irrigation projects of CWC and sending comments to CWC. Reports from Director of State Agriculture Department & comments from PMKSY are called & timely comments are given to CWC after compiling the comments.

(viii) Fixation of National Targets:-

Fixation of Crops-wise & State-wise annual production targets for the country are prepared in the month of April-May.

(ix) Monitoring and Preparation of reports:-

Monitoring & preparation of reports on crop damage due to natural calamity like drought, flood, heavy rains, hailstorms are followed.

(x) Preparation of technical reports:-

Preparation of technical reports based on inputs of Inter Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) visits in the states on crops losses due to natural calamity like drought, flood, heavy rains, hailstorms, etc.

(xi) Coordination:-

Coordination with the assigned divisions i.e. RKVY, Seeds, DM, INM and M & T Divisions on crops aspects.

8. ROAD MAP OF CROP UNIT-I:

(i) Weekly Crop Weather Watch Report/Group Meeting:

- Weekly Crop Weather Watch report is prepared every Friday.
- Crops Unit -I of crops Division starts collection of information every week on Thursday regarding area coverage /sowing of different crops during Kharif, Rabi and Summer season, crop conditions of standing crops and reasons for shortfall, if any in area coverage etc.through the concerned Crop Development Directorates.
- The crop sowing reports are received from concerned Crop Development Directorates on Thursday evening to Friday morning.
- All the Crops Development Directorates collect the significant information on crops coverage and crops condition from their assigned states for submission to Crops Division .
- Besides, Crops Development Directorates (CDD's), States are also contacted over telephone for sending information on area coverage, crops conditions or crops related specific issues, if any by email and this information is checked with the reports provided by the CDD's. If variations are found between their reports, then it is reconciled with available information data/reports.
- After collection information on area coverage /sowing of different crops, crop conditions of standing crops and reasons for shortfall in area coverage,if any other significant information etc. The data are analyzed properly. If any mistakes are found then the concerned Crop Development Directorates are contacted for correction/ revision of the data.
- All the reports received and analyzed then Crops Unit –I prepares the final summary reports for crop-wise area coverage of all crops with description of state-wise higher and less area coverage and then submitted to the higher authority.
- The final approved reports are kept in record in Data Management System (DMS) and also sent by email to higher authority.

- After completion of the final reports for crop-wise area coverage, State-wise area coverage reports of major crops growing States (17-18 states) are also prepared.
- Reasons of less/higher area coverage are prepared based on the information received from the concerned Crop Development Directorates and States by email or over telephone.
- Based on final reports, a summarized PMO reports for Kharif/Rabi/Summer sowing is prepared and a copy of the report is sent by e mail after getting approval from higher authority viz., JS (Crops)/AC/Secretary.
- After completion of all these reports, meetings are held from 2.30 pm to 4.00pm on every Friday under the chairmanship of Adviser, ESA & other officials. In the meeting, all the concerned issues are discussed related to area coverage, standing crop conditions and shortfall in area coverage or any crops related issues.
- After meeting, the concerned issues raised are discussed with the Crop Development Directorates and concerned states and directorates are advised to issue advisories on crops related issues to their assigned states as and when required.
- In the crop weather watch report, rainfall data are also analyzed for the rainfall pattern in different states. Based on the amount of rainfall received, states are classified as excess (+20 % or more), normal (+19 % to -19 %), deficient (-20 % to -59 %), scanty (-60 % to -99 %) and no rain (-100 %) as per standard procedure of IMD.

(i) Video Conference:

- Video Conference is held on every Tuesday with different States to review the Crop status/Condition from 12.00 pm to 2.00 pm.
- In the meeting, generally States are interacted to provide information area coverage /sowing of different crops during Kharif, Rabi and Summer season, crop conditions of standing crops, reasons for shortfall in area coverage if any, any kind of crops losses report due to natural

calamities like heavy rains/hailstorm/ floods/ drought/ high temperature conditions, etc.

- States are advised to issue crop advisories if there is any crops related issues found for standing field crops.
- States are also contacted over telephone for sending revised information, if any, regarding crops conditions, area coverage, or any crops related specific issues by email.
- After getting information by interacting with the states, reports are prepared for submission to the higher authority.

(ii) RKVY Proposals:

CU-I unit starts receiving State Level Sanctioning Committee projects for RKVY Schemes from the RKVY Division for comments. CU-I thoroughly examine the project proposals and give comments based on the guidelines of NFSM, BGREI & CDP.

(iii) PMO/VIP references

CU-I receives PMO & VIP reference letters from various sources directly and indirectly throughout the year. Utmost attention is given to the PMO/VIP references on priority. Required information is collected from different sources i.e. Ministries/Divisions/Departments/Sections and report/reply is prepared after compilation of the information and submitted.

(iv) Coordination with other Departments

CU-I receives letters from different departments on various matters related to Crops. Based on the requirement information are provided to other departments on crop aspects.

(v) EXIM Meeting:

On every month, CU-I receives proposals on Export/Import of various crop seeds. Accordingly, the CU-I unit provides comments and attend the EXIM meeting every month.

(vi) Central water commission project proposals:

CU-I receives the project proposals of CWC. After thoroughly examining the proposals comments are given to CWC. While examining the project the percentage of increase cropped area, benefit cost ratio of the project etc. before submission of comments.

(vii) Parliament Session:

CU-I handles the parliament questions related to crop area coverage and giving reply to the RKVY, INM, DM & M&T Division on behalf of crop Division after getting approval from the competent authority.

(viii) DAC&FW-ICAR Interface Meeting:

Crops Division flag researchable the issues before ICAR and after receiving the recommendations from the ICAR, Crops Division conducts the group meeting to discuss on recommendations with the counter..... of ICAR under the chairmanship of Agriculture Commissioner/ JS (Crops). After finalizing the recommendations Crops Division sends the comments to Extension Division.

(ix) Fixation of National Production Targets:

Based on the production trends of last five years, the National target for food crops, commercial crops, Oil seed crops are fixed state wise & Crops-wise for the current year.

Role of Crops Division

10. ROLE OF CROPS DIVISION:

Crops Division has played significant role in boosting area, production and productivity of crops. Foodgrain crops like rice, wheat, pulses and coarse cereals are essential part of our daily diet, which provides everyday energy requirements for majority of the population in India. In order to enhance the production and productivity of these crops and meet the demand of the growing population of the country, Government of India launched a Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National Food Security Mission (NFSM) in 2007. The Mission is being implemented during 12th five year plan with the new target of additional production of foodgrains of 25 million tonnes comprising of 10 million tonnes of rice, 8 million tonnes of wheat, 4 million tonnes of pulses and 3 million tonnes of coarse cereals by the end of 12th five year plan. From 2014-15, the crop development of cotton, jute and sugarcane have also been subsumed under NFSM. Besides NFSM, Government of India is also implementing various crop development schemes/ programmes such as Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY), Bringing Green Revolution in Eastern India (BGREI) and Crop Diversification Programme (CDP) a sub scheme of RKVY, and National Mission on Oilseeds and Oil Palm (NMOOP) etc.

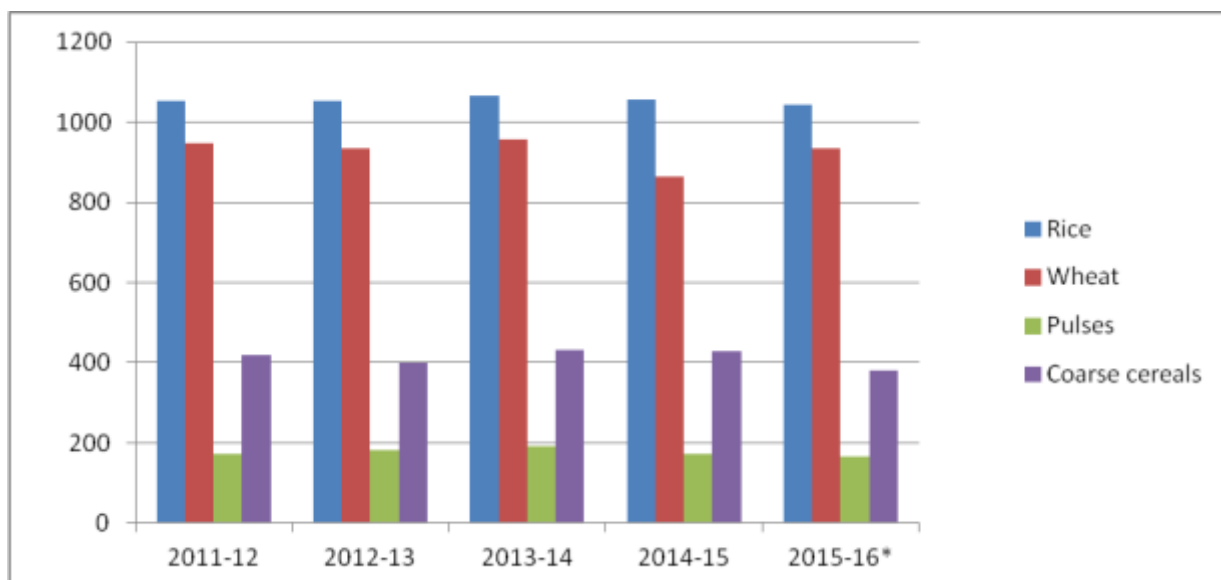

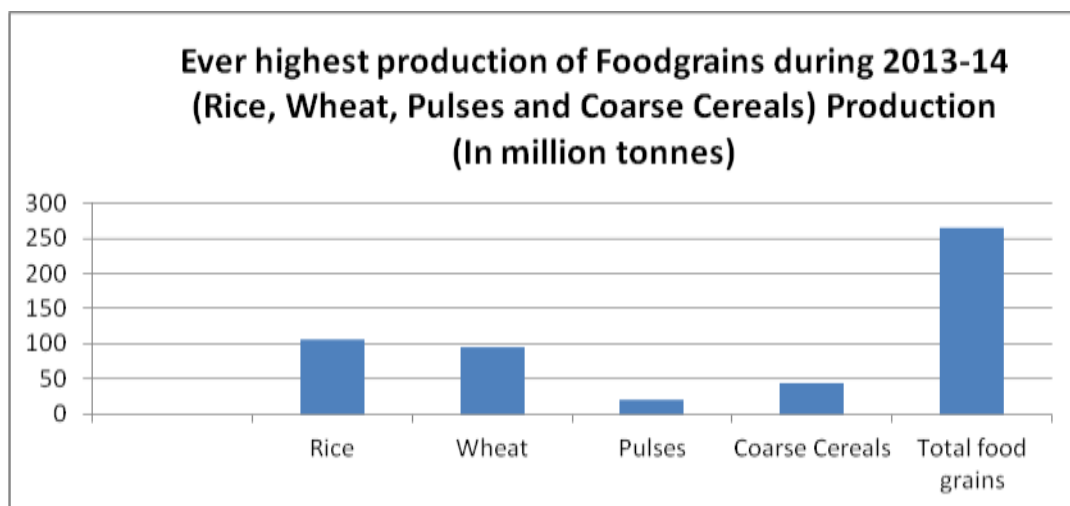

The Government of India provides incentives to the all farmers including small and marginal farmers for critical inputs like seeds, plant protection chemicals, weedicides, sprayers, bio-fertilizers, micronutrients, farm implements and machinery, water saving devices, irrigation pipes etc. besides transfer to technology through technology demonstration, front line demonstration and trainings under various crop development programme to enhance the production and productivity of crops.

Further, Indian Council Agricultural Research (ICAR) is conducting research programme on basic and strategic research related to different aspects of crop improvement, crop production and crop protection in different crop based research Institutes.

Role of CU-I in Crops Division

11. ROLE OF CU-I OF CROPS DIVISION:

On every Tuesday, Crops Unit-I of Crops Division monitors crops situation in the country by reviewing through video conferencing with the states. Various aspects on crops development programmes are discussed in the conference about standing crops condition, area coverage, production and productivity of crops. Besides this, on every Friday, area coverage under crops is monitored and reports are prepared for weekly crop weather watch group meeting held Friday. In the meeting, various issues on crops area coverage, standing crops situation, diseases-pests situation, fertilizer-seeds availability, market position of crops, rainfall situation etc. are discussed. Crop Development Directorates of Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare are advised regularly to issue advisories to the concerned states to protect the standing field crops from natural calamity like flood, drought, heavy rains, high winds or any disease and pest like situation. Fixation of National, State and Crop - wise production targets is done every year by the Crops Unit-I.

The crop-wise production targets and achievements of foodgrains, oilseeds and commercial crops from 2012-13 to 2016-17 is given at **Annexure-I.**

During current Kharif 2016-17, as on date (14.10.2016), the total Kharif area coverage has been reported in more than 1075.71 lakh ha area compared to normal area of 1062.50 lakh ha, which is higher by about 13.21 lakh ha. As compared to normal area, higher area has been covered under Pulses and Oilseeds. About 146.24 lakh ha area has been sown under pulses against the normal area of 108.69 lakh ha, which is higher by 37.55 lakh ha. Oilseeds have been sown in 190.31 lakh ha area compared to normal area of 182.42 lakh ha, which is higher coverage by 7.89 lakh ha. Therefore, very good production of pulses and oilseeds are expected this year.

**A BRIEF SUMMARY ON
AREA, PRODUCTION
AND PRODUCTIVITY OF
FOOD GRAIN CROPS**

12. A BRIEF SUMMARY ON AREA, PRODUCTION AND PRODUCTIVITY OF FOOD GRAIN CROPS:

i. Rice: Rice being important staple food of India and continues to play a vital role in the national food and livelihood security system. India is having largest area under rice crop. However, productivity is lower than world's average productivity. The reason for low productivity is that rice is being grown in the country under various agro-ecologies ecologies in both irrigated and rainfed systems.

States like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, West Bengal, Orissa, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Assam are having huge potential for rice cultivation and there is scope to increase productivity in this region.

National Food Security Mission (NFSM), which is being implemented in 25 states of the country, focus is mainly given to eastern and north-eastern states to improve the productivity over national average.

The State-wise area, production and yield trends of Rice during the last 5 years is given at **Annexure-IV**

ii. Wheat: Wheat is the second most important staple food crop and plays a key role in food and nutritional security of the country. Higher productivity of wheat is mainly confined to states contributed to green revolution like Punjab, Haryana and Western parts of Uttar Pradesh. To meet the ever raising demands of growing population there is need to increase production by enhancing productivity in states like eastern Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Bihar, Gujarat and Maharashtra. Various interventions are being promoted to enhance the production and productivity of wheat under NFSM. Newer varieties, resource conservation technologies like zero till seed drill need to be promoted in eastern India for enhancing production and productivity of wheat.

The State-wise area, production and yield trends of Wheat during the last 5 years is given at **Annexure-V**

iii. Pulses: Pulses are an important source of protein for human being. More than 80% of the pulses are grown in rainfed condition. India is one of the largest producers as well as consumers of pulses, but production of pulses has decreased to 17.15 million tonnes in 2014-15 which was at 19.25 million tonnes in 2013-14. Under NFSM a number of initiatives have been taken in last two years to increase production of pulses like, intercropping of pulses with cereals, oilseeds and commercial crops, cultivation of pigeon pea pulses on farm bunds, additional demonstrations during rabi and summer, demonstrations of pulses under BGREI, demonstrations through KVKs etc.

The State-wise area, production and yield trends of Pulses during the last 5 years is given at **Annexure-VI**

In addition to existing interventions under NFSM-Pulses, from the year 2016-17 new initiatives/ interventions have been taken to increase pulses production like breeder seed production, creation of seed hubs, distribution of seed minikit, promotion of INM and IPM, targeting rice fallow areas, new/improved technology demonstration among farmers through KVKs etc.

iv. Coarse Cereals: Coarse cereals are the important food and fodder crops in semi-arid regions, source of nutrition to the malnourished and regions facing large climatic uncertainties. These have wider adoptability for wide range of temperatures, moisture-regimes. Coarse cereals are mainly grown for dual purpose and used as food for human being and feed and fodder for livestock. Under NFSM-Coarse Cereals, focus is mainly given on demonstrations of improved packages and distribution of quality/ newer variety of seeds for quick adoption among farmers to increase production and productivity of course cereals in the country.

Hence, various intervention are being taken under NFSM for rice, wheat, pulses and coarse cereals should be continued to enhance production and productivity of food grains in the country.

The State-wise area, production and yield trends of Coarse cereals during the last 5 years is given at **Annexure-VII**.
